Oktoberfest History

It began with the Royal Wedding on 12 October 1810 of King Ludwig I and Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen. The original "Oktoberfest" occurred in Munich, on October 12, 1810: For the commemoration of their marriage, Crown Prince Ludwig (later King Ludwig I) and Princess Therese of Saxe-Hildburghausen (namesake of the Theresienwiese festival grounds) organized a great horse race (the marriage took place on October 12; the horse race on October 17 — therefore, there are different dates named as being the first Oktoberfest).

The Oktoberfest is a sixteen-day festival held each year in Munich, Bavaria, Germany during late September (and running to early October). It is one of the most famous events in the city and the world's largest fair, with some six million people attending every year, and is an enjoyable event with an important part of Bavarian culture. Other cities across the world also hold Oktoberfest celebrations, modeled after the Munich event.



Suggestions what to do...where to go in and around San Diego

Before the colder weather sets in be sure to visit some great destinations in and around <u>San Diego</u>. Southern California has a lot to offer when it comes to outdoor activities. We are close to the ocean but also near the mountains. The options are plentiful. In the following you'll find four different locations that we have enjoyed in the past and which are always worth a visit, but fall is just a perfect time to check them out.

Safari Park San Diego

The <u>Safari Park in San Diego</u> is a must in October. Not only since San Diego county has its great <u>"Kids FREE in October"</u> promotion all month long, which lets you visit nearly 40 museums and great destinations like the San Diego Zoo, and also the Safari Park for a fraction of the usual price. But what's really nice about visiting zoos in fall is, that you can actually see the animals! It happened so many times to us; we are in one of the great zoos around California in the summer and... all the animals are hiding from the scorching heat and from us. Frustrating!

So this time we actually could witness antelopes run around the "plains", a rhino taking a walk with its cute and playful little toddler rhino, watch some California bisons picking a fight amongst each other, see a lion lazily catching some of the rare sun rays that day, and have a laugh at the Gorilla encounter. In fact I have never seen any gorillas ever more engaged than these here at the Safari Park. There is so much more to see and for children and adults to explore than we can mention here. Palm Springs Follies "Last Hurrah" - April 2014

When the Damenkreis announced a bus trip to see the Palm Springs Follies "Last Hurrah" I immediately signed on, knowing, that this trip will be booked out fast. The last time they went I reacted too late and the bus was full. Sadly the Palm Springs Follies will close down due to financial hardships as it costs \$6 million a year to run and May 18th was their last performance.

For those of you who may not be familiar with this venue, it was an amazing and incredibly fabulous show. 24 years ago some aging entertainers who had retired in Palm Springs noticed the abandoned 809 seat Plaza Theater, got some friends together, bought it, and hired retired dancers to put on this wonderful show. The ages of the performers ranges right now from 55 to 84 (one of the oldest over the years could still do the splits at 87) and you have seen nothing yet until you see them per-

form. Fabulous figures, incredible legs, unbelievably gorgeous costumes presented in musical Broadway-style revues. Every performer lets you know their age during this show and one can only marvel at how amazing some of us are able to "hold up". As my husband always tells me: "Who said life is fair!"

Their top dancer, Leila Burgess, 78, has been with the Follies for 22 years and retired after working in the Latin Quarter in New York and finishing her career running a dance school in Costa Mesa. Dick France, 84, at this time the oldest performer, had to take a year off in 2004 due to a quadruple bypass but returned in 2005 and is still dancing and disappointed he has to quit.

The emcee and host, Riff Markowitz, 75, a former TV producer who was a co-founder, has never missed a performance and produced a very funny monologue between the dance numbers that had us in stitches. Most of his jokes are about aging as the audience is in the upper years. As you can imagine there is no lack of subject matter. Since they have lost a lot of their entertainers and followers over the years he quipped: "There is a lack of consideration of some old people in that they insist on dying." He also suggests that this is a good place if you have to have a heart attack since they have defibrillators available. I wish I could remember more of his jokes as we laughed heartily throughout his "shtick".

While this show had many hard-core fans, in the last years they have performed to only a half filled theater that has seen a total of 4,849 performances, 4 million audience members and two Guinness World Records (one for the oldest chorus line and another for the oldest showgirls). A documentary made about this show titled "Still Kicking" was nominated for an Academy Award in 1998.





I want to thank the Damenkreis who thought of putting together this fabulous outing that we all totally enjoyed. Our trip was almost way-laid due to very high winds on that day that frequently close the highway to Palm Springs. We did arrive in time for the show but had to miss a nice lunch at one of the restaurants in the area of the theater who certainly will also see a big drop in business. Many of us ogled the dress shops around the area and would have loved to do some shopping afterwards, but the bus driver was waiting for us.

I don't know what great outing the ladies of the Damenkreis will be planning next, but these trips are always available to all of our club members and their friends and thanks to Heidi's wheeling and dealing they are always very affordable. The next time, count me in again.

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25th Anniversary YEARS FALL OF THE BERLIN WALL

25th Anniversary of the Fall of the Berlin Wall

The border between East and West Germany was opened on November 9, 1989. The year 2014 is a year of remembrance, marking the 25th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall - a monumental day in history that led to Germany's reunification. This year is filled with events and ceremonies commemorating the fall of the wall, as well as reflections on a formerly divided Germany. A year-long campaign will take a close look at the events of *November 9, 1989, providing historical context that gives greater meaning to that fateful day.*

On November 9, 1989, jubilant crowds gathered on both sides of the Berlin Wall to celebrate the opening of border crossings between eastern and western parts of the city. Germany's postwar division was over and national unity came less than a year later.

Erected on August 13, 1961 by the communist regime in East Germany, the Wall divided Berlin for 28 years. It cut right through the heart of the city, amputating vital traffic links and separating families and friends. Minefields and border police with shoot-to-kill orders thwarted any further attempts by East Germans to look for a better future in the West. While the communists tightened their grip on people's lives in East Berlin, the western part of the city became a walled-in outpost of freedom and democracy.

Today, Berlin is once again Germany's vibrant capital. The wounds of history have healed. Twenty-five years after the fall of the Berlin Wall, its vestiges remind us that freedom is precious. Freedom would not have prevailed and reunification would not have been achieved, in Berlin and in Germany as a whole, without the steadfast and unfaltering support of our American friends.

We celebrate the 25th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall in a spirit of deep gratitude and with a desire to share our experience - the vision of hope, of unity, and of Freedom Without Walls.

1963 – June 26: President John F. Kennedy visits Berlin, reaffirming US support for this outpost of freedom with his famous "Ich bin ein Berliner!" ("I am a Berliner!") speech.

1987 – June 12: <u>President Ronald Reagan</u> delivers a speech in front of Berlin's iconic Brandenburg Gate in which he memorably demands: "Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall!"

1990 - October 3: After the Wall fell, it was to be another 11 months before Germany was reunited. In summer 1990 a treaty to this effect was negotiated by the two Germanies. East Germany acceded to

West Germany on October 3, 1990, which has since been celebrated as the Day of German Unity and is an official holiday in Germany.

Multifaceted Partnership, Robust Friendship



Germany and the United States of America are bound together by historical ties of friendship. The two countries share common experiences, values and interests, though controversial issues repeatedly arise in bilateral relations. Politics, economics, culture and military cooperation are all facets that make up German-US relations. Today, German-American Day is celebrated on October 6 - the day that Germantown was founded.



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
