At various times over the past years San Diego's Karnevalsgesellschaft has participated in the Lakeside Western Days Parade, held weekend campouts in the mountains, enjoyed parties hosted by our outgoing Prinzenpaaren, supported work parties at the club and even made trips more than half way across the country to attend Milwaukee's German Fest. All of these things, however, fun as they may be in their own right, just helping to tide us over until the next Karneval session.

**Peter Swoboda,** better known as "Dr. Fix It" in Alpine and surrounding San Diego Areas, passed away on July 21, 2020 after a tragic accident.

In 1972 Peter arrived in San Diego. He soon established residency in El Cajon, then moving to Alpine, , where is grounded himself with a house making it a beautiful home that looked like a paradise oasis bring out the best of his green thumb and mother natures beauty, otherwise known as Chateau Swobo, est. 1982, as it says on the large rock as you enter his home.

His property and home was enjoyed by many; with the annual "Summer Sizzle" parties. His presentation was welcoming and "proud as a peacock" of his home and hard work he was committed to in his yard. His eye for Art and Love of Gardening was a true gift, and reflection of in his garden and home.

Being so talented and handy as a Master Craftsman, , Peter successfully established his business as "Dr. Fix It" which he really enjoyed, and the friendship he made along the way. He loved a challenge and creating masterpieces. (to perfection).

Peter was funny if you understood "dry sense of humor" He was a member of the German American Society in El Cajon, where he was the Holfmarshall (master of ceremonies), and told some great jokes! He was also the 2001-2002 Prinz. Elefrrat member and Best Potato Pancake maker ever.

Talk about a Good Man, Peter had a tender and accepting heart, welcoming smile, and strong values and morals. He will be missed by many friends, clients, and loved ones... mostly his garden... I know they were always one with each other and his care for mother earth was in his body, mind and soul.



Many of you, I am sure, recognize this wall hanging from our hall. But do you know it's history? This painting hung in the Rath's Keller of the San Diego Turner Hall, located at 9th and G Street from 1914 to 1945, when a fire destroyed the building. The painting was restored and then presented to the German American Societies of San Diego by the San Diego Turners, Inc. on April 22nd 1972.

Below is some information found on line about the San Diego Turners and their history



The San Diego Turner movement began in 1873, when a group of German- Americans formed the first 'Turn-verein,' or gymnastics club. In the 19th century these fitness clubs were popular across the United States, and provided a place for Americans of German descent to gather to celebrate their heritage and participate in athletic events. The first San Diego Turner club, the 'Teutonia,' only lasted 2 years and was disbanded in 1875 for unknown reasons. In 1884, the Turnverein was re-established by J.A. Cohn. The new

club, called the 'Eintracht,' began with 80 members, but soon grew to 120 participants. The first Turner Hall was built on the corner of 8th and G Streets in downtown San Diego. Shortly after, the San Diego economic boom ended, the Turners fell on hard financial times, resulting in the loss of both their meeting hall and many of their members.

By 1889, a rival Turnverein, the 'Phoeniz,' was present in San Diego. In February 1890, the two struggling Turnvereins met and joined their organizations into a singular, united club. The new Concordia Turnverein had close to 200 members. A new Turner Hall was built on 9th and G Streets, close to the location of the original Hall. Construction was completed in February of 1907. The new Concordia Hall contained a gym, facilities for men and women, meeting rooms, a lodge, a bar, and an auditorium. The Concordia Turners flourished until World War I, a period which saw a sharp drop in membership and participation. The Turners recuperated shortly after the end of WWI until the onset of WWII, when the organization saw a repeat of the previous wartime struggles.

In February of 1945, Concordia Hall was destroyed by a large fire. The club saw a period of near dormancy as the members tried to regroup after both the loss of WWII and the loss of their hall. In 1947, the president of the National American Turners, Carl Weidman, visited San Diego and encouraged the Concordia members to persevere. The Concordia Turnverein changed their name to the San Diego Turners and dedicated a new Turner Hall on March 3, 1951. Though popular in the community, the Turners had a hard time competing with public funded athletic clubs like the YMCA and the YWCA. The club relied only on dues to maintain their finances. In March of 1969 the Turners were forced to sell Turner Hall to prevent themselves from failing financially. After the loss of their third Hall, the San Diego Turners attempted to maintain their activities and participation by meeting in the clubhouse of the Oneira Women's Club, but they were never able to recover. The San Diego Turners were officially disbanded in 1985, just over 100 years after the original San Diego Turner movement began.
